- Completed application packets must be received **no later than Thursday, November 1st, 2018.**

SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION INFORMATION

Selection Criteria and Application Instructions:

- A scholarship may be awarded to **full or part-time students who are enrolled in an accredited 2 or 4 year college or university, and have completed at least one year of study in a Public or Private Security, Criminal Justice, Legal Studies, or Pre-Law program, at the time of application, and seek a security or law enforcement career.**
- Only those applicants, who include *all* of the required documents listed below in their application packet at the time of application, will be considered for a scholarship award.
- Student's academic enrollment and grade achievement attained only during the calendar year beginning January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2018, will be considered.
- Applicant financial need will *not* be a consideration for awarding scholarships.
- Our local chapter's Scholarship Selection Committee will review all submitted applications and required supporting documents, in selecting each scholarship winner. Multiple \$1,000.00 scholarships will be awarded.

Applicants will submit the following required documents:

1. *A completed "Applicant Information" form.*
2. *A copy of your official school transcript, including your cumulative grade-point average if applicable.*
3. *A letter of recommendation from a faculty member or colleague.*
4. *A 250-word narrative that describes your plan for a career in the security profession, including degrees and/or professional development courses, applicable memberships, and specific areas of interest.*

Application Due Date:

- Completed application packets **must be submitted by mail, and received no later than Thursday, November 1st, 2018.**
